Results from the fourth two week snapshot: March 2021

The NSP Snapshots study aims to identify service use trends and describe service user experiences, needs and outcomes of Victorian Needle and Syringe Programs. This snapshot ran from 22nd February and 7th March.

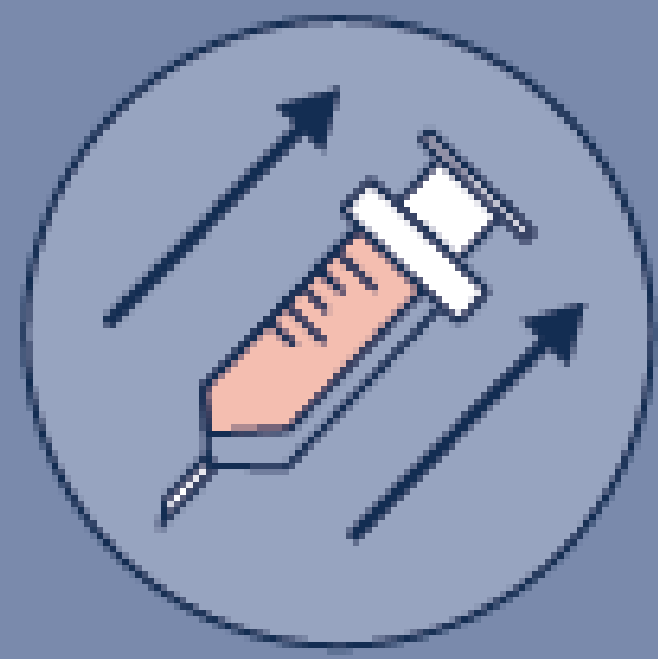
There were **1841 service contacts** in this round that answered the Snapshots survey.

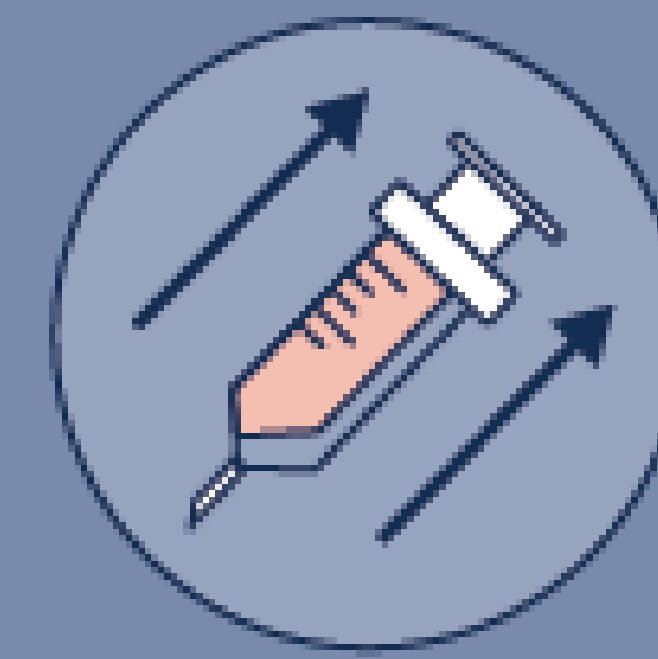

36 (11%) unnecessary as COVID-19 is not serious for most people

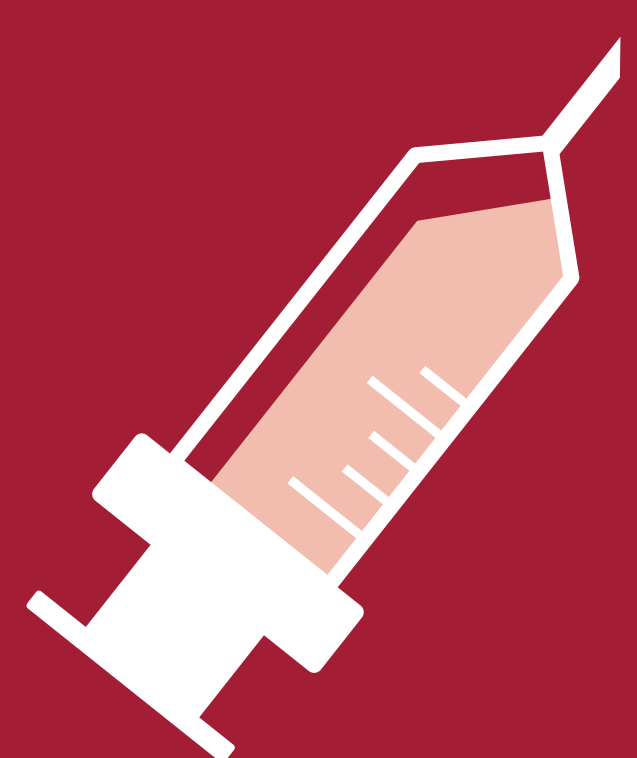
33 (10%) Believe COVID-19 is not real

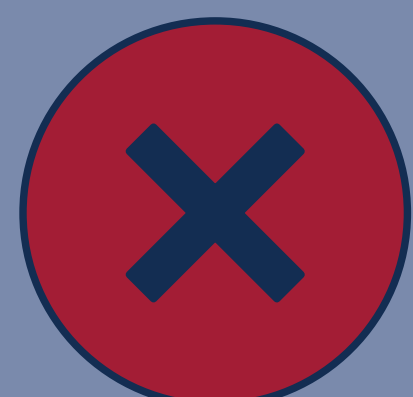
