

35 patients who presented to participating clinics with risk factors for hepatitis C and no previous testing

patients with a record of a positive hepatitis C antibody test and no subsequent hepatitis C RNA test

12 patients with a record of a positive hepatitis C RNA test and no record of initiating treatment

Applying our Learnings

Regional primary care clinics, who took part in the project will continue to receive clinical support from Hepatitis WA.

Hepatitis WA will continue to promote clinical data audits and support practices to improve the quality of data entry.
